Q: What does your average day look like?

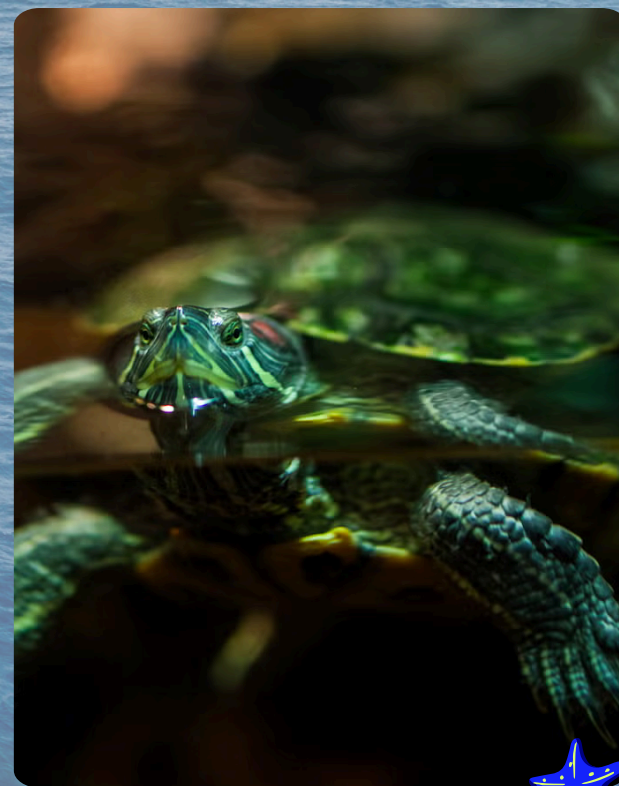
