Q: What does your average day look like?

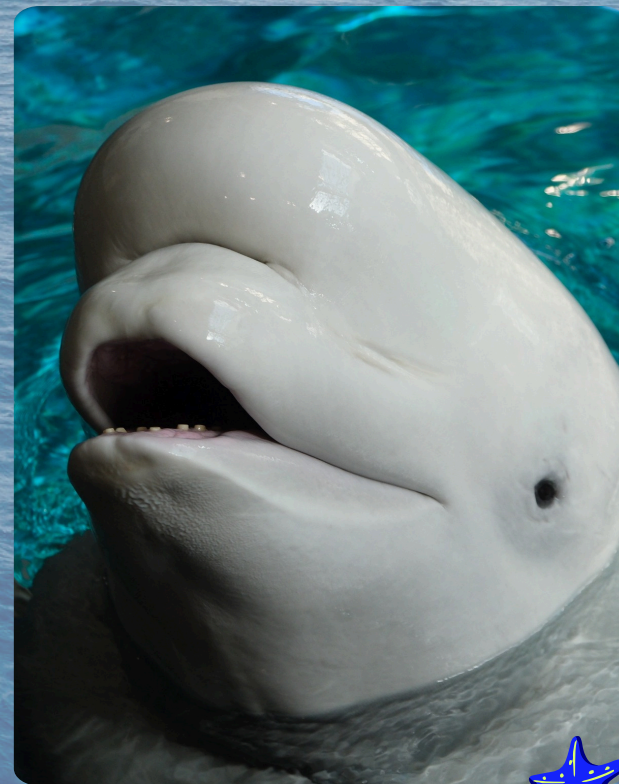

This includes prepping their diets, cleaning their habitats, performing medical exams, conducting training sessions, providing enrichment and running guest encounter programs. No two days are the same when it comes to taking care of the animals.

Q: What path did you take to get to Georgia Aquarium?

A: I went to school and completed bachelor's degrees in marine biology and animal behavioral psychology. During school, I worked part time at a local zoo and completed my SCUBA certification. I did two internships and worked at a smaller zoological facility for 3 years before coming to Georgia Aquarium.
